AD-HOC Crisis Committee

What is a Crisis Committee?

Crisis committees are significantly different from the rest of the committees. Other committees usually concentrate on broad global issues, whereas crisis committees tend to strictly focus on specific issues. Unlike other committees where delegates vote on the topic to be discussed, crisis committees work under two dynamic topics with updates. The first session will present the first topic and the second topic will start as soon as the first topic ends. This gets rid of the need for delegates to choose a topic that provides possible areas of discussion and information on the committee's topic or situation. As mentioned before, crisis committees have "crisis updates" which are real-time situations the delegates must resolve urgently through debate. Crisis committees are overall small committees, normally including around 24 delegates, making the debate have a faster pace and being more dynamic.



What is the AD-HOC Committee?

The purpose of the Ad-hoc Crisis Committee is to test the most capable delegates by presenting a topic on the same day of the conference and preventing them from doing in-depth research. The delegates must be informed about a wide range of historical and international affairs themes in addition to being creative, impulsive, and self-assured enough to handle crisis circumstances with no background information. All attendees should be ready for a conference filled with dynamic crisis updates, situations that change quickly, and intense, fast-paced debate in one of the conference's strongest committees.

Crisis committees are designed to test delegates by placing them into unfamiliar situations and forcing them to collaborate with peers in high-pressure situations to create detailed solutions to complex problems. The same and more is expected of delegates in the Ad-hoc Crisis committee. This year's Ad hoc crew is ready with a range of fresh and thrilling crisis scenarios meant to surprise and test even the most experienced Model UN delegate, making it the ideal choice for anyone looking for a challenge and increasing the degree of competitive pressure.

At CancunMUN we are dedicated to promoting debate's educational benefits. Delegates do not conduct extensive research or draft position papers in advance of the conference, but it is nevertheless important for them to learn how to act quickly and decisively when faced with limited information. Delegates will have the opportunity to observe quick decision-making in a low-information setting, a scenario that global leaders encounter frequently, from the topic's disclosure during the first committee meeting until the debate's conclusion on Saturday.
